COVID-19 booster shots recommended for all children 5 to 11 years old

The CDC recommends that all children between the ages of 5 and 11 years old receive a booster shot of the Pfizer-BioNTech vaccine at least 5 months after they've completed their primary series. All Americans over the age of 5 are now recommended to receive their first booster shot after a certain amount of time has passed (2 months for J&J recipients, 3 months for immunocompromised people 5 years old and older, and 5 months for everyone else).

300,000 COVID-19 deaths could have been prevented with vaccination

A group of scientists suggest that nearly a third of the million COVID-19 deaths in the U.S. could have been prevented if more people had chosen to get vaccinated. Even though the unvaccinated continue to make up a majority of COVID-19 cases and related hospitalizations, the number of Americans who say they won't get a COVID-19 vaccine has remained steady for almost a year. One in three states have fully vaccinated less than 60% of their eligible populations.

Some people now need a second COVID-19 booster shot to be considered up to date

All adults 50 and older and all immunocompromised people 12 and older **should** get a second booster shot 4 months after their first booster shot. People who received the J&J (Janssen) vaccine as their primary series and first booster shot **may** get a second booster shot of an mRNA vaccine 4 months after their first. Only these three populations are currently eligible to receive a second booster shot.
